Statement of Faith

Covenant Classical School is governed by an independent board of trustees and is not part of the ministry of a specific church or officially associated with any particular Christian denomination. Our school community welcomes families from a wide variety of traditions within the historic Christian faith including Protestant, Catholic, and Orthodox. Our statement of faith reflects the beliefs held in common by all Covenant faculty and staff and are taught to students throughout all aspects of our program.

The Trinity

We believe in one sovereign God, eternally existing in three persons: the everlasting Father, His only begotten Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, and the Holy Spirit, the giver of life; and we believe that God created the Heavens and the earth out of nothing by His spoken word.

The Bible

We believe that God has revealed Himself and His truth in the created order, in the Scriptures, and supremely in Jesus Christ; and that the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments are verbally inspired by God and inerrant in the original writing, so that they are fully trustworthy and of supreme and final authority in all they say.

The Church

We believe that the one, holy, universal Church is the body of Christ and is composed of the communities of Christ's people.

Jesus Christ

We believe that Jesus Christ was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, and was true God and true man, existing in one person and without sin; and we believe in the resurrection of the crucified body of our Lord, in His ascension into heaven.

Sin

We believe that our first parents sinned by rebelling against God's revealed will and thereby incurred both physical and spiritual death, and that as a result all human beings are born with a sinful nature that leads them to sin in thought, word, and deed.

We believe that all who receive the Lord Jesus Christ by faith are born again of the Holy Spirit and thereby become children of God and are enabled to offer spiritual worship acceptable to God.

The school building is open to parents from 8:00 am to 4:00pm, Monday through Friday. We ask parents to be considerate of our teachers' preparation time. Parents who wish to speak to a teacher should schedule a meeting or phone call via email. After 4:00pm parents are not permitted access to classrooms. The school office is open until 4:00pm.

Morning Drop Off:

Arrival time is from 7:50-8:10am for all students on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday. Wednesday is Late Start Day. Drop off is from 8:20-8:40am on Wednesdays only. To promote efficiency and avoid unnecessary movement through the church lobby, students are dropped off at Door 3 (near the music room on the east side of the building). Please see our drop-off/pick-up map for more details. Students arriving during the drop-off window will go directly to our supervised Walking Club until they are taken upstairs for the start of the school day at 8:10am (8:40am on Wednesdays).

Afternoon Pick Up:

There are two separate pick-up times. All students are picked up from Door 1 (at the circle drive) at the times listed below. We ask that parents pick up students promptly and on time during these time periods to allow for greatest efficiency. Any Grammar School student with an older sibling or carpool in the Logic School may be picked up during the second dismissal time. These students will be supervised in the gym until that time. Alternate Pick-Up Plans:

Covenant will not dismiss a student to anyone other than the child's regular adult driver or designated pick-up person. In cases where someone other than a parent is picking up a child, Covenant staff members reserve the right to request proof of identification.
